Etiquette

Please observe the following important rules:

- Stay on marked trails to avoid poisonous plants and wildlife. Stay out of garden beds. Wear protective footwear. No hammocks.
- No collecting of plants or animals.
- Do not handle wildlife.
- Bicycles allowed only on paved Matthaei Botanical Gardens Trail and paved driveways.
- Shirts and shoes required indoors.
- No alcohol, campfires, or cooking.
- No smoking please!
- Dogs allowed in designated locations only.
 - On the Matthaei Botanical Gardens Trail and on the driveways.
 - Not allowed on nature trails, natural areas, display gardens or buildings.
 - Must be attended at all times and on leash.

Be on the lookout for snakes! The eastern massasauga rattlesnake, a venomous snake native to Michigan, a federally protected species inhabits the grounds at Matthaei Botanical Gardens. The snake is shy and avoids humans but may strike if threatened. If you encounter the massasauga or any snake, keep a safe distance and do not disturb.
