
Dr.William E. Upjohn's Favorite Peonies

Dr. W. E. Upjohn (UM Class of 1875) was the founder of the Upjohn Pharmaceutical Company, a nationally noted philanthropist, and a passionate peony collector. Dr. W. E. **Upjohn and Nichols Arboretum** Director Aubrey Tealdi shared a vision for a peony garden. His subsequent gift of peonies launched this garden in 1922. 

Dr.William E. Upjohn's Favorite Peonies

Albiflora, The Bride

A large, almost single, white flower. Good foliage and stiff stems. A flower not to be neglected.



While its appearance is pleasing its fragrance is said to be "most intoxicating". This should make it the popular peony in dry America. ["dry America" refers to anywhere alcoholic beverages were illegal, which was all of the United States at the time.]



Large attractive flowers. Shell pink in center fading to white. Stock scarce. A fine variety.

Frances Willard

It takes a good flower to fully deserve to be named after so fine a character as Frances Willard ... This tall strong growing plant producing large yet delicate white flowers, is a

fitting perennial memorial to this woman, who always stood for purity. [Historical note: Frances Willard was instrumental in getting the Constitution amended to allow for women's right to vote.]

James William Kelway

The most satisfactory early white . . . is born pink and if protected from the direct rays of the sun maintains its color to the end, also remains a cup-shaped flower with petals incurved until it spreads its wings for its eternal flight.

Karl Rosenfield

Rosenfield is a brilliant dark crimson of extremely good substance and form. A thrifty grower and a good divider.



Le Cygne

The ranking of this flower shows the place it holds in the hearts of peony lovers... When the stock permits an attractive price everyone will want it. A milk-white globe of immense size and great beauty.

Octavie Demay

A peony with a life experience of more than fifty years and still ... worth while. It is a very large full flower of rose-pink color coming early and surely. It will appreciate being brought into the house before the bud opens.

Festiva Maxima

Like old furniture old flowers are kept in fashion because they are good, not because they are old. Festiva Maxima has its virtues beyond the most and should be used largely because of its price.



Primevere

Like the search after the Holy Grail the search for the yellow peony has not been completely successful. ... One of the sweetest of odors and a good keeper as a cut flower.

Rosy Dawn

All who admire (as they should) Albiflora, The Bride will want to continue this beauty to the end. Rosy Dawn and White Queen or White Lady if you want to pay the price, will keep a sequence.



Therese

It is impossible to say anything against Therese and equally impossible to say anything which has not been said in her praise. Altogether a good flower. Reminds one of a loose butterfly.
